GRANTS

- **DCED Marketing to Attract Tourists Grant (Montour Preserve)**
 - The final check drawn on the DCED grant checking account (refunding to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania \$710.30 in interest earned on grant funds) has cleared and the account now has a zero balance
 - Stoudt will recommend during this meeting the closure of this checking account to prevent possible fraud

- **Montour County 2020 Hotel Tax**
 - As of 10/22/2020, MARC has so far received \$37,126.12 (including interest earned) in 2020 Montour County Hotel Tax grant funds
 - Stoudt, after consultation with Chairperson Mills and Treasurer Dombroski, on 10/21/2020 transferred \$22,864.33 from MARC's savings account to the general checking account to reimburse Hotel Tax-eligible expenses incurred year-to-date (see page 6 of this report for detail)
 - After this transfer of funds, \$14,261.79 in Hotel Tax funds remain earmarked in MARC's savings account
 - The next quarterly disbursement is anticipated in mid-November
 - Stoudt anticipates Q3 Hotel Tax revenues may exceed forecasts made in August due to greater than expected business in local hotels

- **Montour County COVID-19 County Relief Block Grant (no change since last meeting)**
 - Montour County has been advised that it is eligible to receive up to approximately \$1.65 million in funding through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) COVID-19 County Block Grant program (<https://dced.pa.gov/programs/covid-19-county-relief-block-grant-program/>), using funds provided by the federal government to the Commonwealth of PA
 - Montour County Commissioners have stated their desire to assist MARC if possible and are evaluating MARC's eligibility and other requirements
 - It is believed that funding, if received, must be spent by 12/30/2020

- **CSCF Women's Giving Circle 2020 (no change since last meeting)**
 - MARC has received a total of \$935 in funding (including \$500 in grant funding from CSCF) in support of the 2020 Girls ROC Mountain Bike Camp
 - MARC has to date reimbursed \$620 in eligible expenses for the camp and will process remaining expenses in coming days
 - The 2020 camps were very successful, even with mandatory COVID-19 restrictions, and Stoudt recommends MARC continue partnering with event organizers in 2021

- **CSCF Danville Area School District Youth in Philanthropy (no change since last meeting)**
 - \$300 in grant funding has been applied toward the cost of the purchase of the new swing set for Washingtonville's DeLong Park
 - \$300 in grant funding has been applied toward the cost of the Hopewell Park Pump Track design
 - As of 8/21/2020, all grant funding has been expended and Stoudt will plan to submit the required grant closeout reports before year's end

- **DCNR 2020 Non-Motorized Trails Grant**
 - In partnership with Danville Borough staff, Stoudt on 4/22/2020 submitted an application to DCNR's 2020 Non-Motorized Trails grant program for construction of the Danville Borough Levee portion of the North Branch Canal Trail
 - Danville Borough has been notified by DCNR that the grant application has been approved for full funding (\$98,650) to match \$620,629 in previously awarded federal Transportation Alternatives grant funding
 - The grant period is expected to be 1/1/2021 – 12/31/2024
 - The grant will allow for the final design, permitting, and construction of 1.1 mile +/- of handicapped-accessible trail atop the Danville Borough Hospital Run and Upper Susquehanna River Levees, as well as related handicapped accessible parking areas. The project will connect the borough's residential neighborhoods with the Washies' Playground and the Danville Soccer Park and will provide a critical missing link in the larger North Branch Canal Trail project

TRAIL RULES / SUGGESTIONS FOR A GOOD DAY ON THE TRAILS

These trails are purpose-built for mountain biking and are designed to be ridden in a specific direction. To maximize your riding pleasure and minimize nasty head-on collisions, please follow the trail signage.

For your own safety and so that we can keep these trails open, stay on the trails at all times. Even though we're sure you're awesome, the trails are your best bet to get home without a detour to the local emergency room. Portions of these trails pass through a closed landfill and glass, metal, and other fun-ending hazards can and will wreck your day if you try to blaze your own trails. The trails are also close to farm lands, private property, and restricted sites. For your sake—and ours—stay on the trail.

These are multi-use trails in a multi-use recreation area. If you're on your bike, you are very likely to encounter people doing things other than riding. In particular, hunting is allowed on this property by special permit from Danville Borough and hunters have been using this site long before these trails were built. Respect other park users and be good ambassadors of your sport. Our continued use of this park depends upon your good behavior at all times.

To avoid dangerous interactions between user groups during hunting seasons, these trails are closed to all users except hunters with Danville Borough hunting permits during the following periods:

- Saturdays during the spring gobbler turkey season (typically the last Saturday of April through the last Saturday of May, as determined by the PA Game Commission)
- Saturdays during archery season (typically the last Saturday of September or the first Saturday of October through late November, as determined annually by the PA Game Commission)
- All days during the antlerless deer muzzleloader season (typically a one-week period in mid-October, as determined annually by the PA Game Commission)
- All days during the regular firearms antlerless and antlered deer seasons (typically the last Saturday of November through the second Saturday of December, as determined by the PA Game Commission)
- Sundays during any of these time periods when hunting is allowed by the PA Game Commission

In the end, you are making a voluntary decision to ride these trails and you have been advised of some of the perils of doing so. There are potentially hazardous conditions both on and off-trail and you may encounter unexpectedly dangerous acts of man and/or nature. Anything could happen out there, so be prepared. You are choosing to ride at your own risk.

- **Montour Township (Columbia County) Legion Road parcel**
 - No concerns noted since last meeting

- **River Drive parcel (North Branch Canal Trail trailhead and river access)**
 - No concerns noted since last meeting

- **North Branch Canal Trail**
 - Hunting season trail closure signage has been posted at the trail entrance, as well as to MARC's website and Facebook page
 - Trail Steward Wayne Kashner continues to monitor and care for the trail, working to realign problem sections near the Catawissa Boat Club
 - Stoudt on 10/23/2020 picked up and properly disposed of approximately 30 picture frames which had been dumped at the trail entrance
 - No identifiable information could be found to identify the individual(s) responsible for the dumping
 - Stoudt on 10/23/2020 met with representatives of the Bear Hunters' Grove Campground, located at the Montour County / Columbia County line, to discuss ongoing encroachments on the North Branch Canal Trail and SEDA-COG Joint Rail Authority properties
 - New construction of a wooden-framed animal pen was noted on the location where a horse corral had previously been removed
 - Gardens, wood piles, vehicles, and other encroachments were also observed
 - Representatives of the Bear Hunters' Grove Campground reasserted ownership of the land in dispute and strongly objected to MARC's efforts to have the items removed
 - Stoudt advised representatives of the Bear Hunters' Grove Campground that MARC would consider them to be in violation of the agreement reached in 2018 (Bear Hunters' Grove Campground would cease objections to the trail, allow public use of the trail corridor, and remove encroachments identified by MARC) and he would recommend action to MARC's Board to compel the permanent removal of the property encroachments and prevent future encroachments
 - Discussion and possible action is anticipated during this meeting
 - Stoudt will post trail closures on either side of the campground, to remain in effect until the legal dispute is resolved and the encroachments are removed

- New requirements from Governor Wolf's office, effective 10/9/2020, have further reduced capacity restrictions at Montour Preserve facilities

LAND/FACILITY USE
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

BETWEEN

BOROUGH OF DANVILLE

AND

MONTOUR AREA RECREATION COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Borough of Danville (hereinafter the Borough) owns and operates certain agricultural and forested lands and structures in the Borough of Danville and Mahoning Township, Montour County, PA in the vicinity of State Hospital Drive, US-11, Clinic Road, and Toby Run Road (hereinafter collectively referred to as the Borough Farm), as shown in Exhibit “A”; and

WHEREAS, portions of the Borough Farm are operated under special restrictions because of, but not limited to, sewage sludge applications and related Department of Environmental Protection regulations, farmer lease operations, and hunting access; and

WHEREAS, the Borough must meet its various obligations regarding stewardship and management of the Borough Farm and protection of the general welfare of Borough residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the Montour Area Recreation Commission (hereinafter MARC), a Pennsylvania Domestic Nonprofit Corporation (15 Pa C.S. § 5306) operating as a multi-governmental organization in Montour County, Pennsylvania as authorized by an Intergovernmental Agreement of Cooperation, dated 13 May, 2020, has used and wishes to continue to use certain lands and structures within the Borough Farm for public recreation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is a member of MARC and wishes to promote public recreation where appropriate; and

WHEREAS, MARC and the Borough wish to enter into an Agreement for allowance of limited public recreational use of portions of the Borough Farm, subject to the conditions and restrictions set forth here;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, and intending to be legally bound, the Participants agree as follows:

1. MARC shall continue to be permitted to use the structure know as the “pig barn”, shown on Exhibit “A”, for storage of materials and as the starting/finishing location of the Humdinger Trail Runs, held annually on the first Saturday of March. MARC shall maintain locks on all building doors to prevent unauthorized entry to the building and shall provide copies of keys to the Borough. MARC shall not store flammable liquids or other hazardous materials inside the building except as needed for heating and food preparation on the first Saturday of March. MARC shall remove all exterior race amenities from the building grounds by the second Saturday of March. MARC employees and supervised volunteers shall be permitted to access the pig barn at any time during the year, via the access route shown on Exhibit “A”, so long as entry does not conflict with Borough employee or farmer activities which may be taking place on adjacent fields.
2. In the event the Borough wishes to store materials in the pig barn, the Borough shall provide five (5) days notice to MARC to allow MARC to move materials as needed. In the event the Borough needs to store substantial quantities of materials in the pig barn to the point where it is no longer feasible for MARC to also store materials there, the Borough shall provide thirty (30) days notice to MARC to remove its materials. A termination of MARC’s ability to use the pig barn for material storage shall not terminate the other provisions of this Agreement.
3. MARC shall be permitted to use the Borough Farm field access roads, field edge areas, and nearby wooded stream corridor, shown on Exhibit “A”, as part of the Humdinger Trail Runs only on the first Saturday of March each year, except that MARC staff and supervised volunteers may enter these locations from January 1 through the first Saturday of March when needed to prepare the race course. MARC shall make conspicuous note on its websites, Facebook page, printed materials, and any other advertisements that these farm field access roads, field edge areas, and wooded stream corridor are closed to public use at all other times during the year.
4. MARC shall not enter, nor permit its volunteers, racers, or other event attendees to enter the Borough maintenance building site and adjacent parking lot or lawns, shown on Exhibit “A”.
5. MARC shall not enter, nor permit its volunteers, racers, or other event attendees to enter the tillable farmlands, shown on Exhibit “A”.

6. MARC shall be permitted to construct and maintain hiking and mountain biking trails (hereinafter Trails) on the forested portion of the Borough Farm lands as depicted on Exhibit "A". Parking and trail access shall be provided by MARC through the adjacent Montour County owned Hopewell Park, as depicted on Exhibit "A". MARC shall be solely responsible for the stewardship of these Trails and shall be permitted to provide trailhead mapping and non-permanent trail blazes along these Trails. MARC shall be responsible for any permitting necessary for trail construction. MARC shall provide notice to the Borough of any planned trail construction or maintenance activities. MARC shall make every effort to avoid construction or trail maintenance activities during the hunting seasons designated in Section 7 below.
7. MARC shall be permitted to investigate and construct a new trail paralleling the US-11 road corridor, as depicted on Exhibit "A", to connect the Danville Area School District campus and planned athletic fields with Hopewell Park and existing Trails. MARC shall be required to coordinate with the Borough on trail location, design, and maintenance and to secure all permitting and permissions as may be required. The Borough makes no guarantee, implied or explicit, of MARC's ability to secure the required permits and permissions.
8. In order to avoid conflicts with hunters who have been awarded hunting permits by the Borough to hunt on the Borough Farm, MARC shall post notices at the parking area and trailheads that these Trails are closed to all users except those hunters with valid Borough hunting permits during the following periods:
 - a. Saturdays during the spring gobbler season (typically the last Saturday of April through the last Saturday of May, as determined annually by the PA Game Commission)
 - b. Saturdays during archery season (typically the last Saturday of September or the first Saturday of October through late November, as determined annually by the PA Game Commission)
 - c. All days during the antlerless deer muzzleloader season (typically a one week period in mid-October, as determined annually by the PA Game Commission)
 - d. All days during the regular firearms antlerless and antlered deer seasons (typically the last Saturday of November through the second Saturday of December, as determined annually by the PA Game Commission)
 - e. Sundays during any of the aforementioned time periods when hunting is allowed by the PA Game Commission

9. MARC shall be permitted to conduct special events on these Trails during the year except during the periods of time designated in Section 7 above. MARC shall notify the Borough at least thirty (30) days before any special event it intends to conduct. Any special event must comply with the terms of this Agreement.
10. If it is discovered that trail users are entering tillable farmlands or other prohibited portions of the Borough Farm, MARC shall, at its sole expense, post barriers and notices to prevent continued violations of this Agreement. Should MARC's corrective actions fail to end violations of this Agreement, the Borough may order MARC to close the Trails for a period of time to be determined by the Borough.
11. In order to facilitate emergency vehicle access to remote sections of trail, MARC shall be permitted to clear and maintain the former access road from Toby Run Road to the top of the hillside, as depicted on Exhibit "A", subject to the following conditions:
 - a. MARC shall secure any required erosion and sedimentation control permitting.
 - b. MARC shall ensure that proper erosion controls are maintained to protect Borough lands and adjacent Mahoning Township roadways.
 - c. MARC shall ensure that the existing gate remains closed and locked at all times, except while maintenance work is being conducted, and a copy of the gate lock key shall be provided to the Borough.
 - d. No motorized vehicles shall be permitted to use this road, except as may be needed in case of emergency or during times of road maintenance, trail construction, special events, or maintenance operations where motorized equipment is necessary. MARC shall provide to the Borough at least five (5) business days prior notice of any planned work events fitting this criteria.
12. No camping shall be permitted on the property.
13. MARC shall not be permitted to use herbicides on the property unless specifically requested by MARC at least five (5) business days in advance and approved by the Borough. If approved, any herbicide use must be done by a licensed applicator.
14. MARC shall provide to the Borough proof of General Liability Insurance in the amount of \$10,000,000, provided through the Pennsylvania Intergovernmental Risk Management Association, naming the Borough as an additional insured party, and shall continue such coverage at all times during the duration of this Agreement.
15. This Agreement shall be valid for five (5) years from its effective date and shall be renewable in five (5) year increments if so agreed by both the Borough and MARC.

16. The terms of this Agreement shall not be modified except through written agreement of both the Borough and MARC.

17. This Agreement shall not be terminated before the agreed expiration date unless one or more Participant violates the terms of this Agreement or unless otherwise agreed by both Participants.




